



FACTS ABOUT ORU

- ORU, with 23 major buildings, is located on 263 acres in scenic south Tulsa, Oklahoma.
- ORU offers 63 undergraduate majors, 14 master's programs, and two doctoral degrees. The largest majors are Business Administration, Pastoral Christian Ministry, Mass Media Communications, Psychology, Biology, and Nursing.
- ORU is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission and is a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
- ORU is a member of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities (CCCCU), the Oklahoma Independent Colleges and Universities (OICU), and the Council of Independent Colleges (CIC).
- ORU has affiliation agreements with Livets Ord University in Uppsala, Sweden.
- The number of for-credit students served for spring 2008 was 3,082, with students coming from 49 states and 61 countries.
- The top five states for student enrollment are Oklahoma, Texas, California, Florida, and Illinois.
- The male-to-female ratio is 43:57.
- Current student-to-teacher ratio is 14:1.
- More than 50 percent of undergraduate faculty and 100 percent of graduate faculty hold terminal degrees.
- ORU has 191 full-time and 101 part-time faculty and 600 staff.
- ORU has more than 22,000 graduates worldwide and a total alumni population of almost 38,000.
- Golden Eagle athletes participate in eight NCAA Division I men's and women's varsity sports: baseball, basketball, golf, tennis, volleyball, track, cross-country, and soccer.
- The 2006/07 budget was \$85 Million.
